LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE

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The goal of the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice curriculum is preparation for careers in the field of law enforcement: police and sheriffs' departments, federal and state agencies, retail/hospital/industrial security, and private investigative agencies. As well as meeting the needs of students interested in the field, the curriculum may help to satisfy agencies' requirements for college credit or degrees, and to improve skills of individuals already employed by law enforcement agencies.

If you are interested in transferring your Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice coursework to a four-year college or university, consider the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Pre-major for Associate in Arts degree. This Pre-major is for individuals interested in pursuing law enforcement careers at the federal level and for criminal justice careers where a baccalaureate degree is required.
