Introductory activities include improvisational work to orient the new actor to the camera with the intent to reduce self-consciousness while building cinematic skills.

Auditioning for Theater

Cold reading skills, prepared short scenes for commercial/tv auditions, examination and critique of headshots/resumes as well as discussion of appropriate audition etiquette will also be included. Prerequisite: THE 103 or consent of instructor.
